Catechism of the Catholic Church

The Catechism of the Catholic Church is a reference book that details official Catholic doctrine. Divided into four parts, it covers four key topics: 1) The Profession of Faith, 2) The Celebration of the Christian Mystery, 3) Life in Christ, and 4) Christian Prayer. References to the Catechism are often noted "CCC" (Catechism of the Catholic Church) followed by a number. The number refers to the paragraph in the text, not to the page number. The Catechism can be found at many bookstores (including Immaculate Conception's Inspirational Gift Shop on Seneca Street), or the full text is available online at the following link:

The entire part four of the Catechism (CCC 2558 – 2865) is relevant to this presentation, but the following passages relate specifically to Father Jeff's remarks.

2564 - 2565	Prayer as being in the presence of God; Prayer as communion – an action of God and of man
2567	Prayer starts with God and continues with our response to Him
2573	Jacob's prayers (see also Gen 28:10-22)
2626 – 2643	Types of Prayer
2697	"But we cannot pray 'at all times' if we do not pray at specific times, consciously willing it"
2721	Three major types of prayer: vocal, meditation, contemplative
2728	Overcoming 'failure in prayer" or obstacles in prayer
2729	Difficulties in prayer: distractions
2761	"The Lord's Prayer 'is truly the summary of the whole gospel"
2759 – 2865	The Lord's Prayer (The Our Father)
